



GUIDANCE FOR PARTICIPANTS AT EASTER EGG TREASURE HUNT EVENT

This short guide aims to help participants identify and act on possible hazards during the Easter Egg Treasure Hunt.

Organisers and participants have a duty towards themselves, to fellow participants and the public to treasure hunt safely.

FCC will provide a treasure hunt map and volunteers will be dotted on the route to ensure the participants (children with their parents) stay on course.

We ask that the participant abide by current Covid-19 guidelines:

FCC will have a First Aid Kit.

GENERAL SAFETY RULES

- 1. Follow the treasure hunt map and stay on course - this is the safest route.**
- 2. Children under the age of 18 should be supervised by an adult and permission for their participation should be gained from a parent or guardian.**
- 3. When picking up the Treasure Hunt prizes (Easter Eggs - please ensure you read the labels, items may contain nuts and other allergens)**
- 4. Clothing:**
 - Enclosed shoes and ankle socks
 - Dress yourself and the children in appropriate clothing: Warm outdoor wear for a chilly April's day or a hat and sunscreen for a sunny day
 - Rain jacket in case of wet weather

Method Statement:

The Friends of Clapham wish to hold an Easter Egg Treasure Hunt on 3rd April 2022. The timing would be from 10:00 am to 13:00pm.

Colourful Signage to act as clues will be attached to benches and a map to guide the participants along the route created by Friends of Clapham Common.

There will be volunteers dotted along the route and all children are to be accompanied by adults throughout the route. The route will follow main pathways in Clapham Common.

It will be FCC responsibility to clear of any litter and repair any possible damage caused by organisers, volunteers or participants of the Easter Egg Treasure Trail.

The organisers have provided a risk assessment. If any issue should arise outside the carefully planned risk assessment this should be directly discussed with the organisers.

Money raised will be reinvested into Clapham Common.

Safeguarding

The organisers have a duty of care towards the volunteers and participants of the Easter Egg Hunt. It will be the organisers responsibility to deal if any accident happens. Possible risks have been identified in the risk assessment form provided.
